- Makeya: Next to the P1 and P2 building, the treasurer of the TPSS SGA has been victim of vandalism. Someone broke into her car and stole her personal effects, but a ranger from the TPSS campus intervened and helped her. Other robberies happened around the area. Asks the Student Council to help reinforce security with CCTV cameras.
