## **Grant Theme**

"Achieving Student Success Through Bold, Innovative, and Transformational Opportunities"

The MC Foundation Innovation Fund has up to \$40,000 for projects that advance student access, completion, and post-completion success and address bold and innovative opportunities that align with our transformational aspirations are ideal initiatives for this grant. The grant is made possible this year through the generosity of Montgomery College Foundation donors.

Projects that have direct linkage to student success, social justice, equity and inclusion, advance student completion, student post-completion success, and extend the impact of our educational environment into the community are ideal initiatives for this grant. Grants that promote collaboration and cross-functional teams will be given greater consideration.

We are looking for your best thinking and innovative strategies that will impact a broad range of students. Faculty, staff, administrators, and students are eligible to submit proposals. Students desiring to participate are required to partner with a faculty or staff member to submit an application.

# Statement



### About relevant themes

- Student success
- · Student graduation, completion, and retention goals
- Student transfer goals
- Equity and inclusion
- Part-time students
- Support for newly enrolled (first-time) students
- Civility
- · Building a culture of evidence
- Social justice



- Description of the proposed project
- · Explanation how the project connects to the grant theme
- Emphasis on the collaborative and innovative elements
- · Measureable outcomes
- · Estimation of the number of students who will be either directly or indirectly affected by the proposed project
- Timeline for implementation
- · Research/data to demonstrate a need for the proposed project



- A detailed explanation and justification
- Less than two pages

## **Evaluation Rubric**

Applicants are encouraged to use the following criteria to evaluate the quality of their proposal:

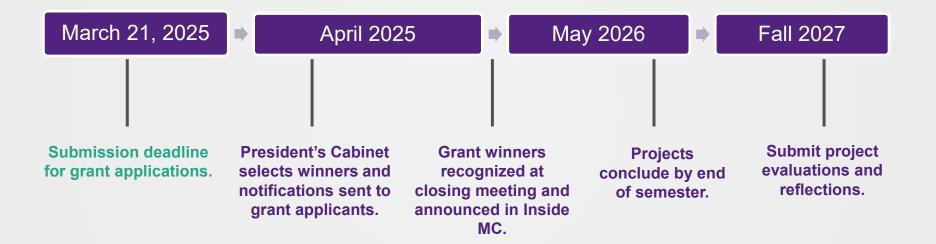
Description & Objectives	Offers specific, clear, and obtainable objectives that align with MC's goals and the innovation grant theme. Includes budget justification and timeline for implementation.
Innovative	Demonstrates engagement in a critical conversation, issue, or idea that generates a proactive solution to the challenges and opportunities facing MC's students and the community.
Improves Student Success	Promotes specific improvements to student success and/or the broader College community.
Measurable Outcomes	Clearly states benchmarks for success and measurable outcomes that identify what participants are expected to receive/learn as a result of engaging in this project and provides a plan for data collection during implementation.
Collaborative	Demonstrates a high level of collaboration between students, faculty, staff and other identified departments for project planning and implementation and/or how the project leverages expertise across disciplines or units.
Student Impact	Provides specific numbers of students and audience projections (preference given for higher number of students impacted directly or indirectly )
Data	Supplies College and industry data supporting and documents need for the project. Clearly documents data origin and source. Method for data collection and analysis supports stated objectives/outcomes.



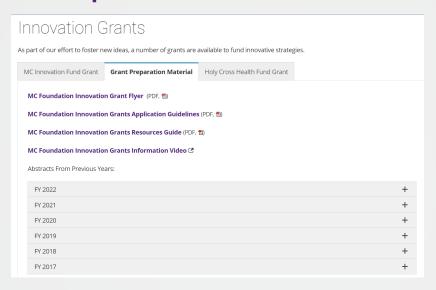
